FREMONT PLAN BOARD NAMED

A five member planning Board has been named in the town of Fremont, according to Supervisor Joseph F. Winkler of Hankins. The new Board becomes the 15th unit in Sullivan County of 22 political subdivisions. Fremont is the 10th town to become involved in the County planning program. Appointed to the Board were George Woolley, a salesman; Mrs. Marge Hillriegel, a housewife; Charles Geier, a retired policeman; James McManus, an accountant; and, Mrs. William McCoo, a housewife. Frederick Starck of Callicoon, Chairman of the Sullivan County Planning Board, praised the township for its action. He noted that the town was one of the first communities in the County to adopt the state junk yard model ordinance. Woolley has been named Chairman. The first meeting in November was attended by County Planning Administrator Joseph Purcell, Starck and Raymond Sherwood, recently elected President of the County Federation of Planners.

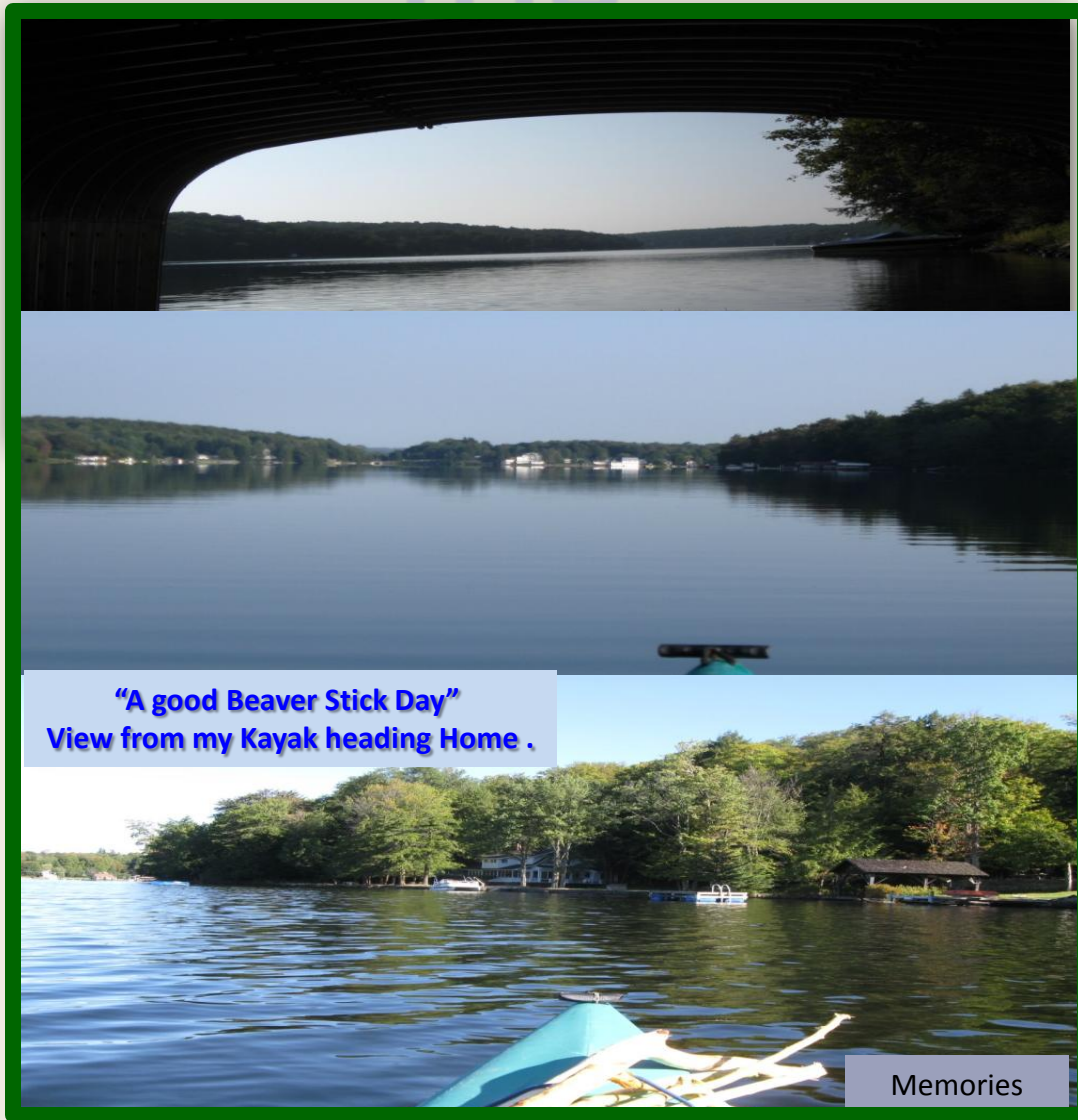
